sentative of adult Canadians. The sample was weighted according to gender, age, education, region, and 2021 federal election vote. Demographic weighting targets come from the 2021 Canadian Census. The weights range from 0.004 to 2.959, with a mean of one and a

standard deviation of 0.39.


