In addition to weighting by age, education, social class and ethnicity (weighted and unweighted figures shown in the tables), YouGov also weighted its raw data by political attention and Vote in May 2015.

Headline voting Intention data was additionally weighted by how likely respondents said they were to vote, and whether they voted at the General Election.
