The system Britain currently uses to elect Members of Parliament is called "First Past The Post" (FPTP), where voters select ONE candidate, and the one with the most votes wins.

It has been suggested that this system should be replaced by the Alternative Vote (AV). Voters would RANK a number of candidates from a list in order of preference. If a candidate wins more than half of the '1st preference' votes, a winner is declared. If not, the least popular candidates are progressively eliminated from the contest, and their supporters' 2nd and subsequent preferences counted and shared accordingly among the remaining candidates in successive rounds of voting. This process continues until an outright winner is declared. Electors won't have to rank all candidates if they don't want to and the winner won't necessarily get more than 50% of all votes cast.
