Currently university tuition fees in England are capped at £3,290 a year. Tuition fees are normally paid using student loans, which students repay once they graduate and are earning above a certain wage.

Lord Browne's review into university finance, published last month, recommended that the government abolish the cap on university tuition fees and give universities the freedom to set whatever fees they wanted. The government has rejected this advice, and instead proposed retaining a cap on tuition fees, but raising it to £9,000 a year. These could still be paid using a student loan.
