Barclays Bank has been fined £290m after it was discovered they had lied about what it was costing them to borrow money in order to manipulate LIBOR - a key interest rate. There have been calls for an inquiry into the LIBOR fixing scandal.

Some people have called for a Parliamentary Inquiry, made up of members of the House of Commons and Lords. This would be quicker and cheaper and allow new banking rules to be put into law next year.

Other people have called for an Inquiry led by a Judge, which would be independent of Parliament. This would take longer and be more expensive but could be much wider ranging.
