The coalition government have switched off the Contactpoint database of UK children. The database contained the name and addresses of all under 18s in Britain, along with details of their parents and doctors, and was available to police officers, social workers and some teachers. The database was intended to improve communications between the different agencies looking after vulnerable children

Supporters of the move criticised the database as being inefficient and an infringement of civil liberties. The database's defenders have claimed that abolishing the database will put vulnerable children at risk.
