1. Do you usually vote in primary elections?

Yes 62%
No 38%

2. As you may know, in a closed primary only voters who are declared members of a political party are allowed to vote in that party's primary. Have you ever voted in a closed primary?

Yes 41%
No 46%
Don't remember 13%

3. As you may know, in an open primary voters get to choose, on election day, which party's primary they will participate in. Have you ever voted in an open primary?

Yes 38%
No 47%
Don't remember 15%

4. As you may know, in a jungle primary all candidates, regardless of political party, run in the same primary. The top two vote getters then run against each other in the general election. Have you ever voted in a jungle primary?

Yes 16%
No 68%
Don't remember 16%

10. When it is allowed by state law, do you think Republicans who vote in Democratic primaries genuinely prefer one of the Democratic candidates the most or do you think they are trying to disrupt the Democratic party?
