1. Do you think the government should or should not require parents have their children vaccinated against infectious diseases (e.g. measles, mumps, whooping cough)?

Should	69%
Should not	18%

2. Do you think children who have NOT been vaccinated against infectious diseases (e.g. measles, mumps, whooping cough) should or should not be banned from attending public schools?

Should	58%
Should not	23%
Not sure	19%

3. California, Mississippi and West Virginia now have laws that ban children from attending school if they have not been vaccinated. The laws grant exceptions for children with valid medical reasons for not being vaccinated, but they do not grant exceptions for religious or personal beliefs. Do you approve or disapprove of state laws that require children to have vaccinations but do not grant exceptions based on religious or personal beliefs?
