


Figure 1: Obama Approval - All Adults




Figure 2: Obama Approval - Registered Voters




Figure 3: Congress Approval – All Adults




Figure 4: Congress Approval – Registered Voters




Figure 5: Direction of Country - All Adults




Figure 6: Direction of Country - Registered Voters

**Target population** U.S. citizens, aged 18 and over.

Sampling method Respondents were selected from YouGov's opt-in Internet panel us-

ing sample matching. A random sample (stratified by age, gender, race, education, and region) was selected from the 2010 American Community Study. Voter registration was imputed from the November 2010 Current Population Survey Registration and Voting Supplement. Religion, political interest, minor party identification, and non-placement on an ideology scale, were imputed from the 2008 Pew

Religion in American Life Survey.

Weighting The sample was weighted using propensity scores based on age,

gender, race, education, news interest, voter registration, and non-placement on an ideology scale. The weights range from 0 to 6.4,

with a mean of one and a standard deviation of 1.2.
