In an AV election, the '1st' preference votes are counted first. If a candidate wins more than half of the '1st' votes, a winner is declared. If not, the least popular candidates are eliminated from the contest, and their supporters' subsequent preferences counted and shared accordingly between the remaining candidates. This process continues until one of the candidate's secures a majority of the vote (50%+) and is declared the winner.
